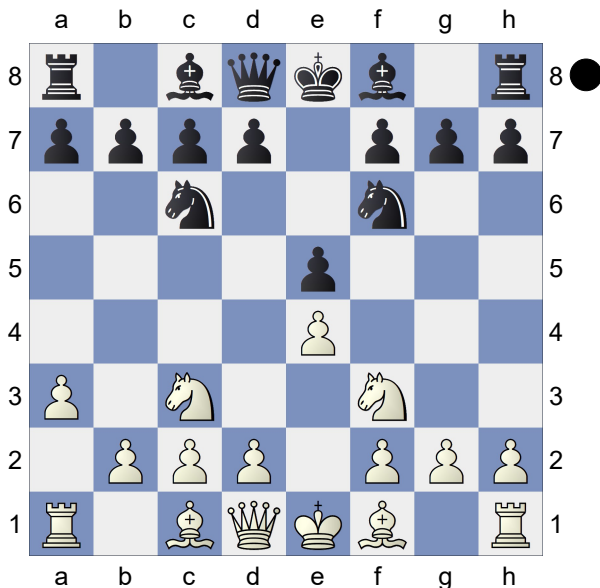

Now, with colors reversed, that b4 square isn't available. The line that especially amused me (more laughter) was 1.e4 e5 2.Nc3 Nf6 3.Bc4 Nxe4 4.Qh5 Nd6 5.Bb3 Nc6 6.Nb5!, the Weaver Adams line. Of course there are other moves available...
