Jim Henry Davis and his family who lived on North Pike. He was 2 miles from elementary school, 7 miles to high school, 1 mile from church. The store was 2 miles away and they went about 4 times a month. They likely would have walked. They rented a frame home with a tub – no water though. That came from a spring 300 yards from the house. There were no toilet facilities inside or out and a wood fireplace heated their 4 room house. Among their personal possessions was a guitar and a sewing machine. Their church preference was Baptist and James was a farmer who occasionally worked in timber.
