





Persistent Evidence









What Worked

- Invest in emergency planning
- Keep manuals up-to-date
- Understand responsibilities
- Act decisively
- Assess and isolate damage
- Establish vendor relationships
- Work together as a team

What We Learned

- Communicate clearly, consistently and frequently
- Work closely with insurance and claims representatives
- Involve local first responders in emergency planning
- Plan for recovery time
